number of books in the library.

Deciding what price to use in our analysis posed another problem. Financial aid can lower the cost of attending college significantly, and often the best schools are also the most generous; at some schools, fewer than half the students pay full price. But not everyone qualifies for aid, and schools may hand out sharply different amounts from year to year, depending on the needs of the students they admit. Another cost complication: at public institutions, tuitions are far lower for state residents than for others.

To create the most consistent system for cost comparison, we decided to use the school's full official price, and to use out-ofstate charges in the case of public schools. One result of this approach is that a number of the most famous names in higher education such as Harvard and Stanford — did not make our list of 10 best buys, even though their large endowments enable them to offer a great deal of financial aid to qualified students. For students who get such help, of course, those schools are great bargains. Similarly, the public schools we cite are even better deals for residents of those states. But low tuition was not a requirement for making the top 100: while Cooper Union, with its minuscule \$300 annual fee, easily topped our private list, Caltech made it all the way to No. 2 with a tuition of \$13,495, which makes it more expensive than 75% of the 1,000 colleges described in the

Schools that charged less than their "expected" cost scored highly; those that charged more fell in the rankings. We eliminated schools whose performance scores indicated that they provide a below-average education. The top 100 public schools and top 100 private schools are listed on the opposite page.

We used performance data that could be compared fairly from school to school. Everyone has his favorite benchmark. Thomas S. Anthony, dean of admission at Colgate, suggested we look at how much money each school devotes to student instruction. James Wickenden, an educational consultant in Princeton, N.J., said that the number of students that go on to get a Ph.D. is a good indicator of the faculty's ability to excite students about the subjects they teach. A number of experts cited the graduation rate as an excellent measure of how good a job the school does in satisfying the needs and demands of its undergraduates. Among the other yardsticks we included in our evaluation: the SAT scores and class rank of incoming freshmen, the student-faculty ratio, and the

tables that start on page 74.

We did not consider two-year colleges and those that attract mainly adult students, and we eliminated narrowly specialized and sectarian colleges. We included science centers such as MIT and Caltech, however, because they offer a wide range of undergraduate studies and degrees in addition to the technical training they are known for. We omitted several schools with unique characteristics, most notably the three service academes — West Point, Annapolis and the Air Force Academy. They offer excellent education at no charge but require graduates to devote at least five years to military service, thereby masking their actual "cost."

One cautionary note: While our rankings highlight those colleges providing strong educations at prices that are more than fair, they are by no means intended to be a definitive guide to college choice. When shopping for a school, you will want to consider numerous other criteria, which are discussed in depth elsewhere in this issue.

f assessing academic quality is tough, trying to calculate a school's value — its quality relative to price — is an even more difficult task. But after extensive consultation with educational experts and statisticians. **MONEY** developed a system to examine all schools and identify the ones that deliver the best education for the buck.

Here's how we did it: We used statistical analysis to determine how much each school might be expected to cost, based on 17 measures of academic performance, and then we compared that figure to its actual cost.

JOHN BERNARD MULGREW, O.P.

Jubilarian

Born: Professed: Ordained: Died: April 10, 1913 August 16, 1932 June 16, 1938 May 26, 1991

"A true son of Saint Dominic, Father John B. Mulgrew's entire priestly career has been a realization of his founder's ideal, 'contemplata aliis tradere,' that is, 'to contemplate and to give to others the fruits of contemplation'."

- Sister Janet Fitzgerald, O.P. in the Molloy College President's Medal Citation of February 28, 1991

John Aloysius Mulgrew was born in Philadelphia, PA, on April 10, 1913, the son of James Francis and Sarah 'Sadie' (Roach) Mulgrew. He attended St. Veronica's Grammar School in Philadelphia from 1918 until 1925. After a year at St. Columbia's High School in Philadelphia, he enrolled at Aquinas College High School in Columbus, OH, graduating in 1929. He spent the next two years doing undergraduate work at Providence College in Providence, RI.

John Mulgrew entered the Dominican Novitiate of St. Joseph's Province at St. Rose Priory in Springfield, KY, in the summer of 1931, receiving the religious name Bernard. (However, for most of his Dominican life, his friends affectionately called him 'Soggy'!) He made his first profession there on August 16, 1932. For the next three years he studied philosophy at the Dominican House of Studies in River Forest, IL. He made his solemn profession at St. Joseph's Priory in Somerset, OH, on August 16, 1935. He studied theology there for a year before moving on to the Dominican House of Studies in Washington, DC, where he continued his theological studies. He was ordained to the priesthood at St. Dominic's Church in Washington on June 16, 1938, by the Most Reverend John M. McNamara, Auxiliary Bishop of Baltimore. After a further year of theological studies in Washington, he was awarded the prestigious Lectorate in Sacred Theology.

In 1939 Father Mulgrew was 'loaned' to the Western Dominican Province of the Holy Name, spending the next nine years teaching theology at St. Albert's College in Oakland, CA. He also assisted in the spiritual formation of the Dominican students there. From 1948 until 1952 he taught philosophy and theology at Trinity College in Washington, DC. From 1952 until 1954 he served as chaplain at the Dominican Nuns' Monastery of Our Lady of Grace in North Guilford, CT. From 1954 until 1957 he was again 'on loan,' this time to the Trappist Monks of St. Joseph's Abbey in Spencer, MA, where he instructed the younger members of the community in theology. His love of Thomism and his unique ability to teach Thomisitic theology is still gratefully remembered at Spencer.

theology is still gratefully remembered at Spencer. In 1957 he began his twenty-one year teaching career at St. John's University in Jamaica (Queens), NY, where he taught philosophy on the undergraduate and graduate levels. He also taught at the St. John's Campus on Staten Island, NY. During part of this time, he was a member of the Dominican community at Sacred Heart Priory in Jersey City, NJ; at other times, he resided closer to the St. John's Jamaica Campus. As had been his custom since the early 1940s, he continued to spend many of his summers teaching philosophy and theology at different colleges and sisters' motherhouses in various parts of the country.

In 1978 Father Mulgrew began his final assignment at Molloy College in Rockville Centre, LI, NY. He spent the last thirteen years of his life doing what he always loved most to do, teaching philosophy and theology to eager young students. In his usual personal and scholarly manner, he taught (among other things) the difficult course in medical ethics to hundreds of Molloy College students; he also served as assistant chaplain of the College. In 1988 he received the College's Ten-Year Service Award. In February of 1991, less than three months before his death, he was awarded the College's highest award, the President's Medal, "for his charismatic Dominican teaching in the philosophy department and the pastoral benefits of his priesthood to all who called upon him."

By early 1990 Father Mulgrew's health had gone into serious decline. He continued to reside at Molloy College, often requiring professional nursing care. Father John A. Madigan, O.P., and Sister Janet A. Fitzgerald, O.P. the College's President, were particularly mindful of Father Mulgrew's needs. On May 26, 1991, just as the members of the Province of St. Joseph were gathering at Providence College to celebrate a Provincial Assembly, Father John Mulgrew was called home to the Lord after a long life of devoted priestly service.

Father Thomas J. Ertle, O.P., Prior Provincial, was the principal celebrant of a Mass of Christian burial for Father Mulgrew in the Chapel of Molloy College on May 30, 1991. Father John T. Carrigan, O.P., a classmate and close friend, was the homilist. Many of Father Mulgrew's associates, students, and friends participated in the Mass. Afterwards Father Mulgrew's body was laid to rest in the Dominican Plot at All Souls' Cemetery in Pleasantville, NY.



ACADEMIC HERALDRY

The caps, gowns, and hoods worn at college and university functions date back to the Middle Ages. Monks and students of those days wore them to keep warm in the damp and drafty 12th century castles and halls of learning.

The gown for the bachelor's degree has a semi-stiff yoke, long pleated front, and intricate shirring across the shoulders and back. It is primarily distinguished by its long pointed sleeves.

The holder of a master's degree wears a gown with the same yoke effect as the bachelor's. The gown, however, is worn open, and the very long sleeve is squared and closed at the end, the forearm coming through a slit near the elbow.

The gown for the doctor's degree is also worn open. It has broad velvet panels down the front and three velvet bars on the large, bell-like sleeves. This velvet trimming may be either black or the color distinctive of the field of learning to which the degree pertains.

Generally, all caps may be of serge or broadcloth. In addition, doctor's caps may be of velvet and adorned by a gold tassel.

The hood gives color and distinction to the academic costume. The hood — a black shelllike affair of varying size for the three degrees and material to match the gown — is silklined stressing the colors of the institution conferring the degree. The hood is then bordered with velvet of the color signifying the respective fields of learning.

The colors indicative of the various fields of learning are as follows:

It is important to note that the field of learning he	aving prior mention in the conferment of a

degree, and not the department governing the major work, determines the color that is proper for the velvet of the hood. The doctor of philosophy degree requires the blue velvet irrespective of the major field. If more than one degree is held, the gown and hood of the highest degree are worn.

Some of the institutional colors to be seen at an academic ceremony are as follows: Catholic University, lemon yellow with white chevron; Columbia, light blue and white chevron; Fordham, maroon; New York University, violet; St. John's University, bright red and white chevron; Molloy College, cerise with white chevron.
