As our students triumphed, so too did our nation; freedom over communism, and the rule of law and order over aggression, to win the cold war and Persian Gulf War respectively.

The cost of the above mentioned victories: a four trillion dollar federal deficit, a stagnant recession-ridden economy, and an astronomical burden on the shoulders of our graduates, their children, and grandchildren.

The only thing more ominous than this burden would have been not facing the challenges of the past; and conceding defeat by default.





So sets the world stage for our graduating class and the current student body. Reflections of the past four years bring to mind the growth and evolution of our fine institution.

Molloy celebrated its 35th anniversary, admitted Soviet nursing students, awarded its first Masters of Science degree, and placed 55th nationally for "the best education for the dollar," according to Money magazine.





Molloy proudly announced its 93% passing rate for the Nursing State Board — National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX). This score exceeds the percentage passing rate for first time Baccalaureate candidates in both New York State and at the national level.




With the exception of construction on the new academic building, the most noticeable change has come to our student population — now boasting an increased male population.

STRONG SHOWING IN REBUILDING YEAR

In a season described by Coach Judy Mc-Cleary as a "rebuilding year," the Molloy Women's Volleyball team finished their fall schedule with a 15-11 record and a strong showing in the New York Collegiate Athletic Conference championship tournament.

The 1991 squad proved to be a talented group of athletes according to Coach Mc-Cleary, although they occasionally "lacked the enthusiasm and hustle needed to win at this level. "The Lady Lions played well when they wanted to," said the coach. "When they

wanted to win, they usually did."

They proved that theory in their matchup against Southampton in the NYCAC tournament. Despite losing in five games to the same team earlier in the fall, Molloy returned the favor, defeating Southampton to advance to the semifinals. The Lady Lions were also impressive in defeat, as they bowed to eventual NYCAC champion Dowling in the semis."

In the final poll of the 1991 season, Molloy ranked tenth among all the colleges and universities in the eastern region. They were ranked as high as eighth during the course of the year, and "could have done better," added Coach McCleary. "But, this was a rebuilding year for us, and next year, we'll have only one senior on the team."

This fall, the Lady Lions were guided by three senior captains, Kelly Simpson, Tracy Weiner, and second-team All-Conference selection, Maria Sblendorio. When Molloy played up to their potential, it was usually these three seniors who led the team. Said Coach McCleary, "I couldn't pick any one over the other two. They're all fine players."

Next fall, the Lions will look to new leaders with the loss of their three captains. Leaders such as All-Conference sophomore Stefanie Christian and freshman setter Geralyn DeMatteo will be expected to play key roles as the Lady Lions roll on.

The Women's Basketball team, coached by Bob Houlihan and Howard Haag, finished an over-achieving season at 15-12, tying for fourth in the New York Collegiate Athletic Conference.

"We did much better than expected," said Coach Houlihan. "We really had no height except for Maryanne Marshall." As a result, the Runnin' Lady Lions were forced to rely on their perimeter shooting and strong defense. Led by co-captain Kathleen Murphy, the team finished in the top ten in the nation in three-point shooting percentage.

Karen Jorgensen, the team's only senior, headed the defensive effort, "playing tenacious defense all season," said Coach Houlihan. He also complimented her "for hitting the big shot whenever we needed it."

Marshall and Murphy enjoyed successful junior years, scoring their one thousandth points and earning All-Conference honors — Marshall was named to the first-team and Murphy to the second-team. Margie Duck, another junior, fell five points short of the 1000 mark.

"The entire team played exceptionally well," complimented Coach Houlihan, who listed the upset of Adelphi as the highlight of the season. "With no time on the clock, we were down by a point. Margie Duck sank both ends of a one-andone and we won the game by a point."


Coach Houlihan, who was assisted by





PIONEERS

IN TRIBUTE TO



Sister Teresa Margaret Hoessbacher, O.P., Ph.D.

At the age of 85, after serving for 66 years as an Amityville Dominican, Sister Teresa Margaret Hoessbacher was called to her eternal reward on Monday morning, December 16, 1991.

Sister Teresa Margaret began her ministry as an outstanding educator at St. Thomas Apostle, Woodhaven in 1927. From 1936-55, Sister taught and touched the lives of many young women in Bishop McDonell Memorial High School, Brooklyn. In 1955, Sister Teresa Margaret was transferred to Molloy College, Rockville Centre as one of our pioneer educators. For the next 22 years, Sister was well-known as a Professor of European, American and Russian history and Professor of Historiography. She also served as Chairperson of the History Department (1955-62) and Academic Dean (1962-64). In 1977 Sister Teresa Margaret retired to Rosary Hall, Amityville. Due to failing health her last years were spent in Carlin Hall, the Dominican Sisters' Infirmary. It was here that she died.

Sister Teresa Margaret was a reserved, quiet woman whose dry sense of humor was the delight of her students and her Sisters. Sister Teresa Margaret's prayerful life and acceptance of God's will in all things was exemplary to those who knew and revered her. She will also be remembered as an outstanding historian.

Sister Mary Charles Mayer, O.P., M.L.S.

Pioneering marked the dedicated life of Sister Mary Charles who passed to her eternal reward on July 2, 1992. As early as 1934, she, an able Latin teacher, joined the pioneer staff of Dominican Juniorate, Water Mill, L.I. Three years later, she was sent to the pioneer staff of Dominican Commercial HS, Jamaica, where she established and directed its excellent library. Her most challenging task, however, attended her Library assignment to the newly-founded Molloy College which welcomed its first class to temporary quarters in 1955. Beginning with a single room and a single carton of donated volumes, Sister forged ahead. Upon resigning from Directorship in 1972, the beautiful expansive James E. Tobin Library, equipped with 52,000 volumes plus other categories of reading materials were a tribute to her tireless efforts. She remained a cataloguer until her retirement in 1989. The Molloy College Library stands as a memorial to Sister Mary Charles. As a member of the Board of Trustees (1964-1966), Sister shared many responsibilities as a concerned



Trustee of the College. For her long dedicated service to Molloy (1955-1989), Sister Mary Charles was awarded the title, Professor Emeritus in October 1989.



Frank Smith, Ph.D.

In 1955, Dr. Smith joined the faculty of pioneers who established the standards by which Molloy College has become known. He came from Brooklyn College to assist a fledgling Molloy in organizing its Mathematics Department. His broad experience and expertise not only provided the necessary ingredients for the installation of that department, but also the definitive insights as to what would constitute the characteristics and qualities of the educational practices at Molloy.

He was an indefatigable worker, friendly, courteous, fair-minded, generous with his time and talents, in short, a man of integrity. His love for learning was contagious, a fact noted quite readily since the first Math major (Class of '59), received a fellowship for her Ph.D. in Mathematics. Other similar recipients soon followed.

After a long and rewarding career as a college educator, Dr. Smith retired; but he continued his enthusiastic membership in the Society for the Preservation of Barber Shop Quartet Singing in America. His love for music was the basis for his

work to develop the Glee Club at Molloy.

Dr. Smith, a loving husband, devoted father, and dedicated teacher passed away on February 7th at the age of 89.

BELOVED FACULTY



Stewart Ross, Ph.D.

Before coming to Molloy in 1968, Dr. Ross held professorships in 4 colleges and spent several years exploring the tropics of Brazil, Venezuela, and Vietnam. He was a Fellow of the Explorers Club of New York City and each summer, while at Molloy, explored the Arctic regions in search of economic deposits of metaliferous minerals and uranium.

Upon his arrival at Molloy, he assumed the Chairmanship of the Physics Department which he held for 15 years. He also accepted the role of Moderator of the Science Club. To meet the interests of Molloy's students, Dr. Ross developed courses in gemstones and other areas of the physical sciences.

Beyond the realm of the classroom, Dr. Ross accumulated a vast experience from his many and varied travels as a prominent explorer. Through these

enterprises, he produced numerous scholarly publications. For his many contributions, Molloy presented Dr. Ross with the Distinguished Service Award in 1980.

Then, on October 12, 1989, he was the recipient of the title, Professor Emeritus.

After a wonderful career as an educator and scientist, Dr. Ross departed from this life on June 29, 1992.

William N. Talmers, Ph.D.

Dr. William N. Talmers' educational preparation included a Bachelor of Science from Babson Institute, Massachusetts, with highest distinction, and a Ph.D. in Economics from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. Drawn to share his expertise with others, Dr. Talmers began his career in the teaching profession with a Teaching Fellowship at M.I.T., Assistant Professor of Economics at Bucknell University, Pennsylvania, and taught part-time at Hunter College. The business world, too, benefited from his exceptional expertise in economics when he became Vice President of the European-American Economic Corporation. After eleven years in that position, he opened his own business, the W. N. Talmers Company, in New York City, which he presided over for eleven years.

The cold statistics of economics became exciting in the skilled hands of this expert teacher. Dr. Talmers had the ability to bring to his students the relevance of economics to the real world. Students' growth and intellectual development had consistently been the primary concern of Dr. Talmers, as attested to by many of those who entered the business world equipped by his teaching.



For his total commitment to the ideals of business, and to the students of Molloy College, his service on the Faculty Advisory Committee for International Peace and Justice, the Faculty Tenure-Promotion Support Group of the Faculty Development Committee, advisor to the Faculty Contract Committee and his service on the Library committee, he was awarded the President's Medal on Feb. 28, 1991.

Illness compelled him to retire in 1990 from his cherished role in the classroom. Then on Friday, July 10, 1992 the Lord called him to his eternal reward.

May their souls and all the souls of the faithful departed rest in peace.

ACADEMIC HERALDRY

The caps, gowns, and hoods worn at college and university functions date back to the Middle Ages. Monks and students of those days wore them to keep warm in the damp and drafty 12th century castles and halls of learning.

The gown for the bachelor's degree has a semi-stiff yoke, long pleated front, and intricate shirring across the shoulders and back. It is primarily distinguished by its long pointed sleeves.

The holder of a master's degree wears a gown with the same yoke effect as the bachelor's. The gown, however, is worn open, and the very long sleeve is squared and closed at the end, the forearm coming through a slit near the elbow.

The gown for the doctor's degree is also worn open. It has broad velvet panels down the front and three velvet bars on the large, bell-like sleeves. This velvet trimming may be either black or the color distinctive of the field of learning to which the degree pertains.

Generally, all caps may be of serge or broadcloth. In addition, doctors' caps may be of velvet and adorned by a gold tassel.

The hood gives color and distinction to the academic costume. The hood — a black shell-like affair of varying size for the three degrees and material to match the gown — is silk-lined stressing the colors of the institution conferring the degree. The hood is then bordered with velvet of the color signifying the respective fields of learning.


The colors indicative of the various fields of learning are as follows:

It is important to note that the field of learning having prior mention in the conferment of a degree, and not the department governing the major work, determines the color that is proper for the velvet of the hood. The doctor of philosophy degree requires the blue velvet irrespective of the major field. If more than one degree is held, the gown and hood of the highest degree are worn.

Some of the institutional colors to be seen at an academic ceremony are as follows: Catholic University, lemon yellow with white chevron; Columbia, light blue with white chevron; Fordham, maroon; New York University, violet; St. John's University, bright red with white chevron; Molloy College, cerise with white chevron.

Ours is an age in which many women have taken an active part in our society's commercial and philanthropic life. Today, Molloy College recognizes and honors a woman who, after many years as the devoted wife of Biagio F. Giaquinto, and as the mother of a daughter Caterina, has served with dignity and distinction as a leader in society and business: Caroline Milone Giaquinto.

Caroline, one of eight Milone children, is a member of one of the oldest and bestknown families in Rockville Centre. In business, she has long been associated with the Rockville Centre construction firm, Dominick Milone, Incorporated. She is the Corporation's Senior Executive Officer, responsible for all office management and financial affairs.

Mrs. Giaquinto is an active member of many regional charitable organizations. Among them are the President's Club of Molloy College, the Mercy Hospital League, the Eastern Lieutenancy of the Knights and Dames of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem, and the Female Executive Association. Caroline was a senior member and Secretary of the Rockville Centre Council of the Regina Assembly and Chairwoman of the Molloy College "Night of Song" Committee in 1968. She and her late husband, Biagio Giaquinto, were Co-Chairwoman and Co-Chairman, respectively, of the "Night of Song" Committee in 1967, and of one of the annual debutantes' balls hosted at New York City's Waldorf-Astoria by the Regina Assembly.

During the Second World War, Caroline Giaquinto volunteered to serve with the American Red Cross. She worked as an ambulance driver at Long Island's Mitchell Field Airport, transporting wounded soldiers from the airfield to local hospitals.

Caroline Giaquinto is a model of honorable Christian service and public accomplishment for the students and alumni of Molloy College. In recognition of the admirable example she has set as a wife, mother, commercial executive and benefactor of those in need, Molloy College designates **Caroline Milone Giaquinto** as 1992 Woman of the Year and bestows upon her the St. Catherine of Siena Medal.



DOCTOR OF HUMANE LETTERS SOPHIA KURZ CASEY

In the Book of Esther in the Old Testament we read, "With what honor should she be honored whom the king desires to honor?" Further, in the Book of Proverbs we read, "When one finds a worthy wife, her value is far beyond pearls. Her husband entrusting his heart to her, has an unfailing prize." And in Joseph Persico's book, CASEY, we read, "Sophia Kurz was what Bill Casey wanted and needed — a good Catholic woman who would now become a good Catholic wife, forever in his eyes. The marriage seemed to heed the advice of the sage who said, 'If you would have a successful marriage, then marry a friend.' They had become exactly that to each other."

With what honor, then, should we honor Sophia Kurz Casey, a trustee of Molloy College, a benefactor since its founding in 1955, and presently Honorary Chairwoman of our Capital Campaign?

Sophia Kurz is of German and Irish descent. She is the oldest of eight children and is known to her family and friends from early childhood as "Tootsie." Her father was housing contractor and her family lived in West Hempstead.

On February 22, 1941, Bill and Sophia were married. Her life then became one of many separations, joys, sorrows, and responsibilities. She had to become a world traveller while remaining a loving wife and mother. What stories must be hers. But they will remain in her heart, never to be told.

Mrs. Casey has always been a lover of Long Island and its people. She has been active in the Diocese of Rockville Centre and Molloy College since their beginnings. She is a Lady of the Holy Sepulchre and is the recipient of numerous awards.

Molloy College honors Sophia Casey today for being an exemplar of the valiant women of the scriptures, a devoted wife and mother of her dearest daughter, Bernadette, now married to Owen Smith, a Nassau County attorney. We honor her today for the gentleness which is the sign of her peaceful strength and for the simple modesty which she has always maintained despite her years in the forum of public life. We honor her, also, for her many charitable activities on behalf of the people of Long Island and, in particular, to Molloy College.

With what honor, then, should she be honored? To use Bill Casey's own words in his first letter to Sophia, "I'm not going to try to tell you what I think of you. For I know from experience that my vocabulary is pitifully inadequate for such a task. A further reason is that such an extravagant appraisal as I would find necessary to express myself would seem like empty flattery no matter how much sincerity underlay it."

With pride and awe of her personal strength and character, Molloy College confers upon Sophia Kurz Casey, honoris causa, the degree of Doctor of Human Letters.









WOMAN OF THE YEAR doctor of humane letters katie kelly

Katie Kelly, a successful and popular television critic, surprised her colleagues and viewers in 1989 by announcing her decision to leave WNBC-TV to help the Amerasian children of Vietnam. She had worked for eleven years as a television journalist, appearing on NEWS 4 New York, Live at Five and Entertainment Tonight.

Katie went to Vietnam on vacation in 1988, and was devastated to witness the hardships of the Amerasian children. They were born in wartime — abandoned by their fathers and sometimes mothers — and then by society. Returning to New York, Katie realized she could not forget these children of the streets — they had no one. She now states the easiest decision she ever had to make was to return to Ho Chi Minh City to teach English, and to do whatever else she could to help these helpless Amerasians.

Katie Kelly was born in the small town of Albion, Nebraska. She attended the University of Missouri, received a degree in journalism, history and literature. After teaching English for several years, she began writing for **Time Magazine**, reporting on Hollywood and Broadway from 1966 to 1972. That year her first book was published, **The Wonderful World of Women's Wear Daily**, which was followed in 1973 by **Garbage: The Future and History of Garbage in America.** From 1973 to 1975, she was managing editor of **Women's Wear** and in 1977 and 1978, she was a television critic for the **New York Post**. By the time her third book, **My Prime Time: Confessions of a TV Watcher**, was published in 1980, she was appearing on televised news and entertainment programs.

Katie Kelly's success as a journalist, writer, and television personality is remarkable, but her service to the abandoned Amerasian children of Vietnam has been heroic and has changed her life. Returning to New York in 1991 after a year of teaching in Saigon, she was able, under the Amerasian Homecoming Act, to sponsor the immigration of three young Vietnamese Americans. Katie felt she wanted to be not only part of their past but also of their future. She now spends much of her time helping Amerasian refugees at St. Rita's parish in the Bronx. Her most recent book, A Year in Saigon, will be published this July.

Today, in recognition of her journalistic achievements and her extraordinary spirit of service to those in need, Molloy College is privileged to bestow upon Katie Kelly, honoris causa, the degree of Doctor of Humane Letters.



DOCTOR OF COMMERCIAL SCIENCE RUSSEL H. KITTEL

Molloy College has chosen to honor Russel H. Kittel for his dedication to the pursuit of the common good, and to the ideals of honesty in industry, by conferring on him the honorary degree Doctor of Commercial Science.

Russel Kittel earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Industrial Management from Long Island University. He was co-founder and for twenty-five years the Executive vice president and Chief Operating Officer of Aerospace Avionics, Inc., an engineering firm which designed and produced electronic systems for our nation's Space Shuttle and for many modern commercial aircraft. Russel Kittel was also co-founder and President of Dytek Laboratories, a manufacturer of commercial and recreational marine electronic equipment. Today, he is a Senior Partner of GL Associates, a real estate management and development company located in Bohemia, New York.

Russel Kittel has been an active member of the Islip Town Environmental Council, the Town of Islip Industrial Development Commission, the board of Directors of Hospice of the South Shore and the Advisory Council of Good Samaritan Hospital. Catholic Charities bestowed on Russel Kittel the Caritas Medal in recognition of his commitment to Long Island charities. The Town of Islip awarded him the Outstanding Service Medal for his dedication to the township's citizens. He served as a **RADAR** operator and instructor in the United States Navy Reserve and was honorably discharged after eight years of service.

A devout Catholic and a Knight of the Holy Sepulchre, Russel Kittel is a member of the Bishop's Council of Stewards, a member and former chairman of the Diocesan Development Committee and a trustee of the parish of St. John Nepomucene. The father of four children and grandfather to three, he has lived for thirty-two years in Oakdale, Long Island, with his wife, Grace.

In recognition of his dedication to the ideals of service, industry, and fidelity, Molloy College bestows upon Russel H. Kittel, honoris causa, the degree of Doctor of Commercial Science.


